He also enjoys swimming at the centre located at Macarthur Square that is improving his coordination and contact with a male adult – an important thing for all young kids.

Thursday night attracted a group of families that are becoming our regular attendees. We looked at the Information Kit that is being developed and outlined at the end of this News Sheet, along with a very wide range of topics across all age groups.

One family has an adult daughter who, whilst not officially diagnosed, displays many of the characteristics of Aspergers. Through the telling of their story other families gained an insight into issues and opportunities they may face in the future. Such discussions allow people to express their feelings and ideas without being discouraged and can give them a reference point for the dealing with the many different situations faced by families.

Before we knew it, it was nearly 9 pm and time to go home – two hours of great ideas and much food for thought.
